One of the advantages of living in a free economy is that we have choices about what we buy and how we buy it. What we often lack is information about how things are produced and a full understanding of the implications of a particular product choice.(materials used, expected working life of the product, practicality of repair, environmental impact of its manufacture). By exercising informed choice, we put pressure on producers to work in more environmentally conscious ways.

Choose 2 or 3 of these actions, or discover your own challenge.

- Repair and reuse before replacing.
- Go op shopping!
- Cook from primary ingredients rather than using processed foods.
- Check the country of origin, buy locally if possible.
- Buy Fairtrade Easter eggs!
- Bring your own bags.
