The Vicar's Vibe

Grace alone

We are continuing our series on key themes of the Reformation, and today the readings and the sermon are focused around the theme of we are saved by “Grace alone”. Last week, the theme was “Faith Alone”, and I found myself wondering just how different or even interchangeable these two phrases were.

For my sermon last week, I used the hands of Adam and God painted on the Sistine Chapel by Michelangelo in 1512. It is curious how well we think we know a painting, and how a closer examination can reveal new surprises. This picture provides an illustration for both themes of us



being saved by Grace and Faith alone, in fact it shows that they could be two sides of the same coin – almost. In the painting, God is stretching out his hand in invitation, and Adam's is limp, perhaps tentative. God offers in his hand the gift of Grace, and it is by faith in Jesus Christ that Adam (here representing us all) will be able to open and stretch out his hand in acceptance. Adam holds no tools or good deeds that will qualify him for God's grace.

The reading from the gospel this morning adds shadows and definition to this image of God freely handing out a gift of forgiving grace. In the midst of the wedding party, celebrated by the random people that the King's guards found on the streets, a man is singled out as not wearing a wedding robe, and is unceremoniously ejected. The King comments that many are called, but few are chosen.

So what are the clothes that you put on? Not just, in fact especially not just when you come to church, but as you go through life? Without wearing a symbol such as a cross, can someone tell that you are a Christian by the way you live your life? For we are all offered God's Grace, a gift freely given with love, but not given away for nothing.

No, when Adam opens his hand and grasps God's proffered hand, he effectively shakes hands on agreeing to change his life. To look to Christ and his teaching, and to turn his back on selfish and petty ways of the world. This is our challenge, our daily challenge too. God desires you to be part of the wonderful feast, so don't give up – keep trying on that new way of life.

May God bless you and those for whom you pray.
