Reflection for Second Sunday of Easter:

Happy Easter! I don't know whether you missed the news last week, but Christ is risen, Alleluia!

I have heard many positive comments about Easter and Holy Week last weekend, and I want to thank everyone who joined in, helped or contributed in some way for making it such a meaningful few days.

The reading from Acts this morning seems to answer the "Now What?" that must have struck the disciples after Christ's death and resurrection. It particularly highlights how they pooled resources to ensure that everyone was cared for and describes the actions of an apostle dear to this parish – Barnabas.

His birth name was Joseph and he hailed from Cyprus, and the book of Acts remembers how he sold some land and shared the proceeds with the new Christ followers in Jerusalem. I particularly like that the Apostles renamed him Barnabas "Son of Encouragement".

Our parish needs us all to be encouragers. We need to support those who serve on our Parish Council or take part in our visiting ministries, we need to let the Op Shop volunteers know how much we appreciate them, we need to encourage folk to consider taking a short course in the
